I am therefore glad to learn that prominent workers in this field of science have formed an association and hope that this will lead to greater interest in and more intensive study of Marine Biology in the country.

I am so glad to learn that the Association will bring out a journal devoted to studies in this specialised field. The scope of work is almost unlimited and very little has been done till now. I hope the journal



will not only publish specialised articles dealing with original research but also provide a general forum for discussion among scientists who have made Marine Biology a special field of study.
